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OUR STORY

Michelle founded Little Miracles back in 2010 as a response to the lack of support in place for families with disabled children.

When Michelle was pregnant with her first child, Oliver, doctors told Michelle that her child would be severely disabled, making them "incompatible with life". They said Oliver's life, if he were to make it that far, would not be a life worth living. Michelle felt pressure from many medical practitioners to terminate Oliver's life, making that out to be the kindest thing for him. Michelle and her husband, Paul, decided that for however long Oliver was to live that he would have a family who loved him.

Oliver spent 15 months in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit before he could finally go home with his mother and father. Michelle and Paul had to quickly adjust to the new normallooking after Oliver was hard, but it was the isolation that was truly crippling. Family and friends could not relate to what Michelle and Paul were going through. Their social circles broke down, making them feel isolated and totally alone.

Michelle's story is far from unique. After her desperate isolation and lack of support, Michelle was driven to found Little Miracles in order to stop other families feeling how she did.

Thousands of parents go through similar experiences with no one around to give them a helping hand or to tell them that everything will be ok.

Little Miracles exists to ensure families that have children with additional needs, disabilities and life-limiting conditions can access the care and support they need, to connect with each other in confidence and without judgement.

WHY NOW

Like many people across the country in 2020, our families were some of the most vulnerable and have suffered the greatest due to the Coronavirus pandemic lockdown.

At a time where many support services closed completely with no intention of reopening, furloughed staff or could not provide support in a safe way - the lockdown has left many suffering in silence.

Charities, including Little Miracles, have seen a 24% reduction in total charitable income this year which equates to a £12.4 billion loss across the charitable sector. Little Miracles has just about managed to scrape by with the help of some fantastic volunteers and local businesses that have made some incredibly kind donations to us.

WHAT YOU DID

Whilst vulnerable families were socially isolating at home, our staff and volunteers delivered food and essential medical items directly to their door. This ensured all of our families were able to shield properly and had the necessary supplies to see them through lockdown. As of August 2020, we delivered over 1100 parcels to families in need, most food was donated by local food supply businesses and food banks.

Without this support, Little Miracles would cease to exist.
